Information for the teachers.

This day is suited to year 11 & 12 students who are keen to pursue music at a Tertiary level.

There is no cost for the day and bookings are limited to one day only per school. If students do not want to play in an ensemble, they are welcome to observe instead. All of the Tabor staff and students have police checks which you can view if required. There will be at least two staff present on the day.

Teachers are required to support students who have learning difficulties, disabilities or behavioural problems since most sessions are run by Tabor students. We ask that teachers also sit in on the sessions and ensure your students are participating and being respectful.

Please note that some classes will be held upstairs on the first floor. There is no lift or escalator. It is one short flight of stairs with a handrail.

If you have only a few interested students rather than a whole class, we encourage those students to still attend! There are registered teachers available to supervise the entire day.

The students' class teachers will be posted the information packs and materials prior to the day, to be shared with the attending students.

Students to bring....

- Their musical instrument if they would like to take part in the music ensembles.
- Water bottle and snacks
- Alternative food if they do not want the BBQ provided (or have dietary requirements)

Note: amps, keyboards/pianos and music stands will be provided. If students are willing to sing, our choral vocal group is the easiest ensemble to be a part of!
